

RON ESPOSITO'S *OPEN HEART* VIDEO WINS TELLY AWARD



Cincinnati, Ohio – 16 March 2010 -- Ron Esposito released his first solo CD playing Tibetan brass and crystal singing bowls last fall on his own label, Spiral Music. The CD was quickly added to the playlist of the Public Radio International (PRI) syndicated radio program “Echoes,” which airs locally on WVXU, 91.7 FM and WMUB, 88.5 FM. Esposito learned this week that the video for the CD, called “Open Heart”, has received a bronze **Telly Award** for “Best Online Video”. The “Open Heart” music video was produced by Michael Murray with [Murray Multimedia Resources](#) of Liberty Township, Ohio. Esposito plays the African kalimba as well as ancient Tibetan brass and crystal singing bowls on “Open Heart”, which also features Ric Hordinski on guitar, Janice T. Sunflower on wooden flutes, Jim Feist on tabla, and Doug Perry on hammered dulcimer and percussion. For the video Murray created a visual montage using black and white photographs by [Michael Wilson](#) and Bill Gwynne set to four edited tracks from the CD. [Gwynne](#) also engineered and mastered the CD.

The Telly Award, marking its thirtieth anniversary in 2010, is the TV/video equivalent of an Oscar for film and one of the most sought-after awards by industry leaders, from large international firms to local production companies and ad agencies. A panel of judges selects outstanding local, regional and national commercials and programs, as well as video and film productions. The 2009 award recipients were selected from over 13,000 entries submitted from the United States and countries around the world.
